However, the single-minded activist developed a passion for design, media and music, deepening this with the aim of creating an online platform for the hearing impaired and deaf. On his 19th birthday he launched hearZONE online.

MISUNDERSTANDINGS ARE PART OF SIGN LANGUAGE! - AND THAT IS BRILLIANT! (DE)

NADJA SIEGER has been touring since 1987 as Nadeschkin together with stage partner Ursus and has been in various productions in small theaters, circuses and television from Vienna, to Berlin, New York, Melbourne and Wangen im Allgäu. In 2006, the comedic duo made its first appearance with sign language translators and many times since they have experimented with the pantomimic and comic potential of sign language and its interpreters.

NO EYE CONTACT- CONFESSIONS OF A PARTIALLY SIGHTED MUSIC-JOURNALIST (DE, EN)

NICK JOYCE is a renowned music journalist, who since 1986 has been writing for different newspapers. Throughout his career he has interviewed stars like David Bowie, U2, Massive Attack amongst many others. He is frequently confronted with giving out personal information to the person sitting in front of him - his partial blindness.

ASYMMETRICALLY BILATERAL: WORKS OF A MUTANT DANCER (EN, FR, IT)

ALESSANDRO SCHIATTARELLA has worked for the last 15 years as a professional dancer, traveling and performing with many renowned dance companies. His «mutation» or «asymmetry» started more or less at the same time of his career, changing his body and challenging his identity; making him believe that in some cases «a limit» is somehow self-created and can be transformed into a new possibility. He is interested in sharing stories of mutations /asymmetry and in explaining the way he will transform his own limits into a dance production.

A year ago a 640-page book about and his work in the last twenty years with the title «Theater HORA - the only difference between us and Salvador Dali is, that we are not Dali» was published. Everything you need to know is in there. Except the Freie Republik HORA is missing. This production is one step further to Michael's own demise.

NELE JAHNKE found herself in theatre when working on P14 of the Volksbühne in Berlin and is strongly connected to the Blackmarket of Useful Knowledge and Non-Knowledge since she participated as an intern ten years ago. At Theater HORA she assists, does her own productions, spends a lot of time with the ensemble and works closely together with Michael Elber in the frame of Freie Republik HORA to overthrow herself as a theatre director.

«IF YOU DON'T CHANGE THE RULES, THE GAME ALWAYS STAYS THE SAME» - ON GOAL MANIA: A STAGED PARA-WM-SOCCER- SPECTACLE (DE, EN)

JULIA REICHERT has been working as a dramaturge for several theaters in Germany and Switzerland and has had the fortune to explore various social and artistic peripheries and microcosms in her projects. She is particularly interested in theatre as a social art form, performative learning and the paradox of nature and the representation of the excluded and underrepresented.

EQUAL RIGHTS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IN SWITZERLAND - YESTERDAY AND TODAY (DE, EN, FR)

KONRAD STOKAR is the head of the association cerebral Schweiz, the Swiss self-help organization for people with cerebral palsy (CP). He himself is living with CP and has been an activist in favor of Equal Rights for people with disabilities in Switzerland since the end of the nineties. Since then, he has been working in varying areas in Communications, both in the non-profit sector as well as in the private economy. In addition, he is one of the founding members of BewegGrund, the leading Swiss integrated dance company.

She is head of the Program on Disability Art, Culture, and Humanities, which is devoted to research on and the creation of disability art. Sandahl has published numerous research articles and an anthology she co-edited with Philip Auslander, entitled «Bodies in Commotion: Disability and Performance» (University of Michigan Press) garnered the Association for Theatre in Higher Education's award for Outstanding Book in Theatre Practice and Pedagogy in 2006. She is currently collaborating on a feature-length documentary film on Hollywood representations of disability entitled «Code of the Freaks».

LIFE ARTISTRY- BETWEEN DARK AND LIGHT (DE)

CHRISTINE KUHN already as a child had a strong connection to invisible worlds – to muses like music, poetry, and fairy tales. She calls herself «Münchhausen», like someone who pulls herself out of the mud of demons over and over again. She discovered the power of fairy tales as soul-companions in anthroposophical clinics. In dark moments she has felt connected to great poets like Novalis and Hölderlin. In existential moments muses and words of poets accompany her from buoy to buoy in the sea of life.

BODYLANGUAGE / LOVE OF WORDS - A FEW SENTENCES ON SEX AND DISABILITY (DE, EN)

KLAUS BIRNSTIEL is a literary scholar at the University of Basel. He lives with a 250-pound wheelchair, which takes over many of the uncovered functions of his body. His work deals with cultural representations of disability and sexuality, but also with the question of the relation between body and technology. His research shows that disabled bodies have always been fascinating. It is not only the curiosity of non-disabled people, whose cultural perception Birnstiel is interested in, but also the question of how disabled bodies can look back when they feel exposed to the gaze of others.

I FEEL YOUR LUST (DE)

THERESE KÄMPFER works in the department of care-development and education at the Swiss Paraplegic Centre in Nottwil. She is responsible for the education of patients in the center and conducts seminars around the theme of sexuality and paraplegia consulting newly injured patients about this topic. She is also a nurse, teacher, mother of two children and a wheelchair-user. The regaining of satisfying sexuality belongs to a holistic rehabilitation and the learning of a new sexual competence is central. She believes an attractive woman is a well-informed woman, who knows her possibilities and wishes, and knows how to claim and communicate them.

NINA MUEHLEMANN is currently in the third year of her PhD at King's College London, where she also did her Master's degree in English Literature. Her research focuses include the idea of the disabled supercrip, or superhuman, which was very popular in mainstream media and culture during the London 2012 Paralympics, and the responses to it

Her dissertation on non-professional performers in different theater fields «Ausweitung der Spielzone. Amateure, Experten, behinderte Darsteller im Gegenwartstheater» (2015) represents pioneering research that opens up the field of disability performance in German-speaking Theater Studies.

WITHOUT HAND OR FOOT- THE WORLD OF PEDALS AND PROTHESIS (DE, EN, FR)

ARMIN KÖHLI is working in zones of war and political crisis for the NGO Geneva Call where in dialogue with armed forces, he is trying to improve the protection of civilians. As a disabled ultra-distance cyclist, he has regularly achieved top results. In 2004, he took part in the longest bicycle race of the world from Cairo to Cape Town and finished third. He started to combine sport and politics: With his «tours to ban landmines », where he supported the international movement against perfidious weapons which mutilate people.

SITUATIONS IN EVERYDAY LIFE THAT ARE NOT HEARD (DE)

PIRMIN VOGEL is deaf and wears a hearing aid as well as a cochlear implant. He grew up communicating in spoken language, attended a regular school as well as a vocational school for the hearing impaired. He learned sign language through sport activities with other deaf people. To date, the trained polygraph, with a Bachelor of Arts, shifts in the three different worlds of: the hearing, the hearing impaired and deaf people. He is very familiar with the variety of communication problems and he shares his knowledge in workshops, i.e. for Swisscom Customer Advisory and in schools.

EXERCISE, EXPRESSION, SUBJECTIVITY: DEVELOPING EQUATIONS (EN, FR)

CYBERNETIC BODY UNDER STRESS: REHABILITATION AND SPORTS (DE)

KARIN HARRASER is a professor of Cultural history at the University of Linz and has been studying cultural history and the history of prosthetics technology over the last years. She thinks that although we are already living in close cooperation with machines of all sorts, we still have only a limited repertoire of images, stories, and concepts to conceive of our living (and dying) together with them. Classical questions Karin is interested in concern definitions of a good life, the right to imperfection, and the justice of resources.

ROBERT RIENER is Full Professor for Sensory-Motor Systems at the Department of Health Sciences and Technology, ETH Zurich. Currently he holds a Double-Professorship with the University of Zurich, where he is also active in the Spinal Cord Injury Center at the Balgrist University Hospital. Since his activity in Zurich, Riener has developed robots and interaction methods for motor learning in rehabilitation and sports. His current research interests involve human motion synthesis, biomechanics, virtual reality, man-machine interaction, and rehabilitation robotics. He is the co-founder of the Cybathlon, the first championship for robot-assisted parathletes that will take place in Zürich in 2016.
