

SUSANNE KUTZ is head of the Age and Demography Department of the Körber Foundation and explains how the image of old age is changing on account of coronavirus.

DR. KARSTEN SCHUBERT is a political scientist and explains the concept of biopolitics and why it is an important analytical tool during corona times.

NELE HEISE is a media researcher and consultant for digital media and communication. She shares her knowledge about the corona-app toeing the fine line between naive handling of data and real hope for medical progress.

MERLE BAAKE studied medical computer science and works as a web developer, also developing health apps, and discusses the ethical questions connected to this work.

MAXI SCHINDLER is a feminist »Pro Choice«-activist and explains in this dialogue how the concept of (bodily) autonomy can be understood from a feminist perspective in times of a pandemic.

DR. CHRISTIAN DÖHLER is a linguist. His research took him to the rainforest of Papua New Guinea, where he got to know a solidary health system.

MINE WENZEL works in the field of queer health with a focus on trans*, inter* and non-binary health care at Andersraum Hannover. They share their knowledge and experience around how coronavirus has impacted queer health.

PROF. DR. GERTRAUD STADLER represents the professorship for gender-sensitive prevention research at the Charité - Universitätsmedizin Berlin. Her core interest is personalized interventions for prevention.

KAREN TIEDEMANN is a Reiki master and shaman. She will complement the perspective of conventional medicine with her knowledge of self-healing powers.

DR. MALTE THIEBEN is a historian and shows the historical development of vaccination, which health-political interests are connected to it and why it causes such fears.

PROF. DR. CÉSAR MUÑOZ-FONTELA is a virologist and immunologist. He is the head of the Virus Immunology group at the Bernhard Nocht Institute for Tropical Medicine in Hamburg.

COLETTE GRAS is studying medicine and is an activist at Medibüro Hamburg, where she fights for health care being made available to all people - even if they are undocumented.

DR. ANITA PLENGE-BÖNIG is an epidemiologist and works at the Institute for Hygiene and Environment in Hamburg where she helps educate the population about the pandemic.

OLFERT LANDT is a biochemist and produces test kits for corona. He explains how the development and application of a test works.

BROTHER ELIJA POTT is a Benedictine monk and lives in a monastery. He shares his insights about the experience of isolation from a different perspective.

DR. CLARA SCHLAICH is an expert in nautical medicine and presents the living and working conditions of seafarers during corona times.

JULIE KUHN is a teacher of art, drama and French and shares her strategies for school life in a state of emergency.

DR. TINE HAUBNER is a sociologist and shares her analysis of the precarious care system in Germany and explains why many blind spots are also strategic calculations.

LATOYA OLORUNTOYIN MANLY-SPAIN is a performer and activist and will share strategies of anti-racist protest in pandemic times.

DR. UMESWARAN ARUNAGIRINATHAN is a specialist in heart surgery and talks about racist prejudice of patients and colleagues, and what has to change in the system to put an end to it.

SAMIA KASSID works at the World Future Council in Hamburg with a focus on children's rights. She highlights the situation of those who are most often forgotten in crises.

PROF. DR. YONG-SEUN CHANG-GUSKO is a Professor of Health and Social Management and an expert in resilience. In this conversation she shares her mindfulness strategies.

DR. EVA VON REDECKER is a researcher at the intersection of critical theory and feminist philosophy. She will share her knowledge of possibly revolutionary everyday practices.

SUSANNE BLEIER-WILP is an activist for sex workers' rights and gives an insight into the various life situations of sex workers and the problems they face in corona times.

PROF. DR. JANNIS ANDROUTSOPOULOS is a linguist and researches the corona-induced changes in Hamburg's linguistic landscape.

DR. DIRK ZIMMERMANN and **STEPHANIE TÖWE-RIMKEIT** work as campaigners for Greenpeace in the field of sustainable agriculture and demonstrate the connection between factory farming and coronavirus.

DR. SVENJA AHLHAUS is a political scientist and will discuss the challenges of human-animal relationships in the pandemic.

PROF. DR. JAN PETER SPERHAKE is a specialist in forensic medicine. He was one of the first persons to autopsy patients that died of coronavirus and reveals how dead bodies can be read.

DR. BRIGITTE KÖLLE is an art historian and poses the question of the role of art in pandemic times and how we can design our encounter with it.

YULIA LOKSHINA is a documentary film maker and talks about her film *Rules of the Assembly Line, at High Speed*, which deals with the working conditions in meat factories like Tönnies.

ERIC OTIENO is a political scientist. In his research, he pursues global entanglements of medical drug development and distribution.

DR. MARIUS RAAB is a researcher and psychologist. He works on the psychological workings of conspiracy theories and shares his assessments.

PROF. DR. CHRISTIAN DROSTEN is a doctor and clinical virologist. This personal conversation will be an opportunity to ask any questions that have not been covered in his famous podcast.

MARTIN ZICKLER is a doctoral student at the Heinrich Pette Institute for Experimental Virology. He shares insights into his everyday work and tells the complicated story of the development of the well-known HeLa cell culture.

GESCHE JÜRGENS works as a campaigner for Greenpeace and shares her activist perspective on strategies to understand the humans of late-stage capitalism as part of the global ecosystem.
